Description of Service and Client Group	<p>The Crisis Resolution and Home Treatment Team (CRHT) is comprised of home treatment, Single Point of Access incorporating out of hours, Operation Serenity, self-harm liaison team within A&E and 72 hour Assessment Beds/Discharge Facilitating. The age-range of our clients is 18 years and upwards (no upper age limit but not organic illness). The team is an integral part of the mental health services on the Island and acts as a gatekeeper to all inpatient mental health beds. Since October 2015 the team have also taken on the clinical responsibility for 72 hour assessment beds on the wards.</p> <p>Students will experience acute mental health work with acutely unwell clients within their own homes, where building a therapeutic relationship is paramount. Students will also experience joint working with the Police on the Island in an innovative project called Operation Serenity. Students will have the opportunity to gain experience within all teams/functions of CRHT.</p>
Description of related services & Client group	Liaison with acute wards via CRHT Discharge facilitator. Links with community mental health service (CMHS) via discharge planning meetings. Links with A&E and MAU through crisis and self-harm liaison work. Linking with local Police via Operation Serenity.
