Description of Service and Client Group	<p>The aim of the sexual health service is to provide a range of accessible, high-quality, responsive, cost effective, confidential, sexual health services, to persons residing on the Isle of Wight and to support the delivery of sexual health services in primary care and other community settings through the provision of professional training.</p> <p>The integrated sexual health service aims to improve sexual health by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Promoting local sexual health services effectively and facilitating convenient and timely access to integrated sexual health care for all residents. Where possible these services should be delivered in settings other than on site at St Mary's Hospital. - Reducing inequalities in sexual health by targeting vulnerable groups and communities with greater sexual health needs and tackling the stigma and discrimination associated with HIV and poor sexual health in partnership with other agencies. This can be evidenced by providing in reach services across the Isle of Wight in partnership with other organisations that support these groups. - Improving access to integrated sexual health services by delivering a "one-stop shop" approach to sexual health service provision, ensuring that patients have access to a comprehensive range of support, treatment and care for sexually transmitted infections (STIs), contraception and reproductive health services. Risk assessments should include information on smoking, alcohol, substance misuse and the provision of brief interventions^[1] and signposting (with consent) to local support services where appropriate. - Promoting self-efficacy and reduce unnecessary travel to services through the provision of web-based or telephone advice and/or triage, condom distribution, remote testing, and telephone consultations where appropriate. - Reducing rates of STIs and HIV through the provision of integrated services for STI screening, diagnosis and treatment with services for contraception and reproductive health and the provision of targeted sexual health promotion and partner notification. - Reducing teenage conceptions by providing access to

	<p>contraception services (including LARC) for young people across a broader range of settings and by ensuring that contraception is available as part of all STI and Termination of pregnancy care pathways.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Reducing the prevalence of undiagnosed HIV infection and late diagnosis of people with HIV through the effective promotion and uptake of HIV testing across a broader range of settings. - Delivering a user-focussed sexual health service by involving services users, stakeholders, and related services in service design, development and evaluation. - Maintaining a co-ordinated and sustainable sexual health service model by maximising existing workforce skills and expertise at the Trust and support those trained to Tier 1 Sexual Health Information and developing a sustainable Tier 1 Sexual Health Training programme through the co-ordination of local sexual health networks. - Ensuring quality and value at all times - Maximising effectiveness and the best use of finite resources by reducing service duplication and sharing good practice, where appropriate, developing services in line with local need with referral and partner agencies. - Reducing out of area activity for contraception, STI, HIV and other sexual health services by encouraging and supporting those people who are likely to access services off Island to register with a GP in their new area where appropriate while at the same time maintaining patient choice. - Improving the sexual health of the local population, especially those at risk of poor sexual health by providing evidence based behaviour change interventions tailored to meet the specific needs of target groups/individuals. This can be evidenced by supporting partner notification and tracing for STI's that are notified to them. - Embedding strong clinical leadership across the local sexual health system by supporting, advising and providing expertise to other organisations and providers delivering sexual health services in the locality with both GPs and Pharmacists. The integrated service shall ensure that the integrated sexual health workforce are known to local professionals and can be easily contacted. - Ensuring services are non-judgmental, respectful and culturally sensitive.
<p>Description of related services & Client group</p>	<p>Principles of Sexual Health Service</p> <p>The Provider shall ensure the following key principles are adhered to in the delivery of this service specification:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Confidential, open access and available to anyone requiring care, irrespective of their age, place of residence or GP registration, without referral - Priority shall be given to prevention and early intervention with a focus on young people and most at risk populations - The Integrated Sexual Health Service shall be delivered by a professional integrated skilled sexual health workforce (providing person centred care) - Strong clinical leadership shall be embedded across the local sexual health system - Evidence based practice, innovation and technology shall be used - Ensure quality and value for money at all times <p>Service description/care pathway</p> <p>The proposed Integrated Sexual Health Service will provide a range of interventions via clinics and outreach provision to meet the needs of the</p>
