More specifically, as of today's date, please provide a list of all stillborn children or fetal remains (or parts thereof), stored by the hospital for more than a month (for example, but not limited to, stillborn children, miscarried fetuses, aborted fetuses, etc). There are an additional 21 cases which have been held between 01.12.13 and 31.12.13 which have not been included in the next 'Born too Soon' service as the period for reclaiming by the family for private burial has not elapsed. These will be included in the next service.
