Response –

The time of Discharge should be recorded on PAS as the actual time of discharge; however the time defaults to the time that the discharge is recorded on the system. As long as the discharge is recorded real time on PAS the data will be accurate, otherwise we rely on the User to manually adjust the time which is reiterated during their PAS training.

Historically we utilised the discharge time to identify incomplete Discharge Summaries by recording a generic 23:45 time which would be adjusted once the summary was completed. Whilst this practice is no longer in place now there are a significant number of these included in the figures provided (193 – 12/13 & 37 – 13/14).

1. Provision of Indoor Powered Wheelchairs

1.1. **All** of the following criteria need to be met before the Wheelchair Service can provide an indoor powered wheelchair.

- 1) The client must meet the criteria for the provision of a standard wheelchair from the Isle of Wight Wheelchair Service
- 2) The client must be in receipt of a manual wheelchair.
- 3) The client is medically unable to self-propel manually (this will require supporting medical opinion and information).
- 4) The client is unable to access independently their living accommodation with a manual wheelchair.
- 5) The client has been assessed as being independent with the use of an indoor powered wheelchair.
- 6) The client has been assessed as being able to control the wheelchair without being a risk to self or others.

7) The client agrees to the Isle of Wight Wheelchair Service conditions of loan.

2. Provision of Indoor/ Outdoor Powered Wheelchairs

2.1. **All** of the following criteria must be met before the Wheelchair Service can provide an Indoor / Outdoor Powered wheelchair.

2.2. The client must:

- 1) Be in receipt of an indoor powered wheelchair from the Isle of Wight Healthcare Trust
- 2) Have a potential to benefit from the wheelchair through increased mobility and independence leading to an improved quality of life.
- 3) Be medically fit enough to independently control a powered wheelchair indoors and outdoors:
 - a) Free from conditions causing loss of consciousness and epileptic seizures within the last 12 months, in line with the DVLC requirement for motor vehicle drivers.
 - b) Free from any combination of medical conditions and/ or treatments likely to make independent powered wheelchair control unsafe for themselves, pedestrians or other road users.
- 4) Be safely aware of the environment:
 - a) Have a visual acuity of at least 6/24 (can read a number plate at 40 feet)
 - b) Have a visual field of 120° on a horizontal plane and 20° above and below this plane (equivalent to class 3 vehicle user standards).
- 5) Have demonstrated in a wheelchair mobility test and by other means that they have the insight, intellectual capacity and dexterity to operate an indoor/ outdoor powered wheelchair safely and responsibly on their own and

without assistance.

6) Have a suitable home environment:

- a) Have adequate space for storage of the wheelchair with a power supply for a battery charger
- b) Have adequate space for movement of the wheelchair within their home
- c) Have safe and easy access to the outdoors
- d) Have a local outside environment, which is compatible with a powered wheelchair

7) Agree to the Isle of Wight Wheelchair Service conditions of loan, including the consideration of:

- a) Undertaking of insurance as advised by the Wheelchair Service
- b) Membership of breakdown/ recovery service
- c) Return of other wheelchair(s) on loan from the Wheelchair Service as appropriate

2.3. The wheelchair will remain on loan subject to regular review on the understanding that the client continues to meet the above criteria.
