**(iii) what percentage of Band 5 paramedic posts within the Trust as of 1 December 2016 have been (or are expected to be) job-matched to the new Band 6 paramedic job profile and re-banded accordingly and the reasons for any Band 5 paramedic posts not being re-banded following the recent re-banding agreement.**

**We will be following national guidelines on this but have not yet received enough information to be able to specify.**
