Question a. People are not admitted to A&E they attend, do you want to see admissions to hospital from A&E or A&E attendances?

Question a. A&E attendances - these are not coded using ICD10 codes – therefore we will be unable to respond to this question.

Question b. It is not possible to collate this from our discharge summaries

Question c. We can query the ICD10 code as long as you are aware that they will be referring to admissions rather than A&E attendances.
