Generations with unhealthy lifestyles

People living longer and needing more support

Increasing numbers of people managing long-term conditions eg Diabetes

Growing financial pressures on public services

The higher costs of providing services on the island



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Projects to transform health and care provision in the community

Background

- Evidence from the UK and world communities show better more effective services are:
 - Locality Based
 - Multi-disciplinary
 - Integrated across services and service providers
 - Designed around the individual
 - Minimising intervention through empowerment at a community level
 - Preventative in nature, seeking to minimise an individual's reliance on statutory services

Develop community assets to ensure focus on wider social determinants of health

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Develop workforce to deliver safe and sustainable Island services

Ensure the most at risk people receive care/case management and care coordination

Implement a whole population, outcome based payment system

Case management of those most at Risk

and self care

Implement integrated locality services who provide integrated physical, mental health and social assessment, care and plans

Focus on prevention, self care and self help

Implement co-ordinated access to all Island health and wellbeing services

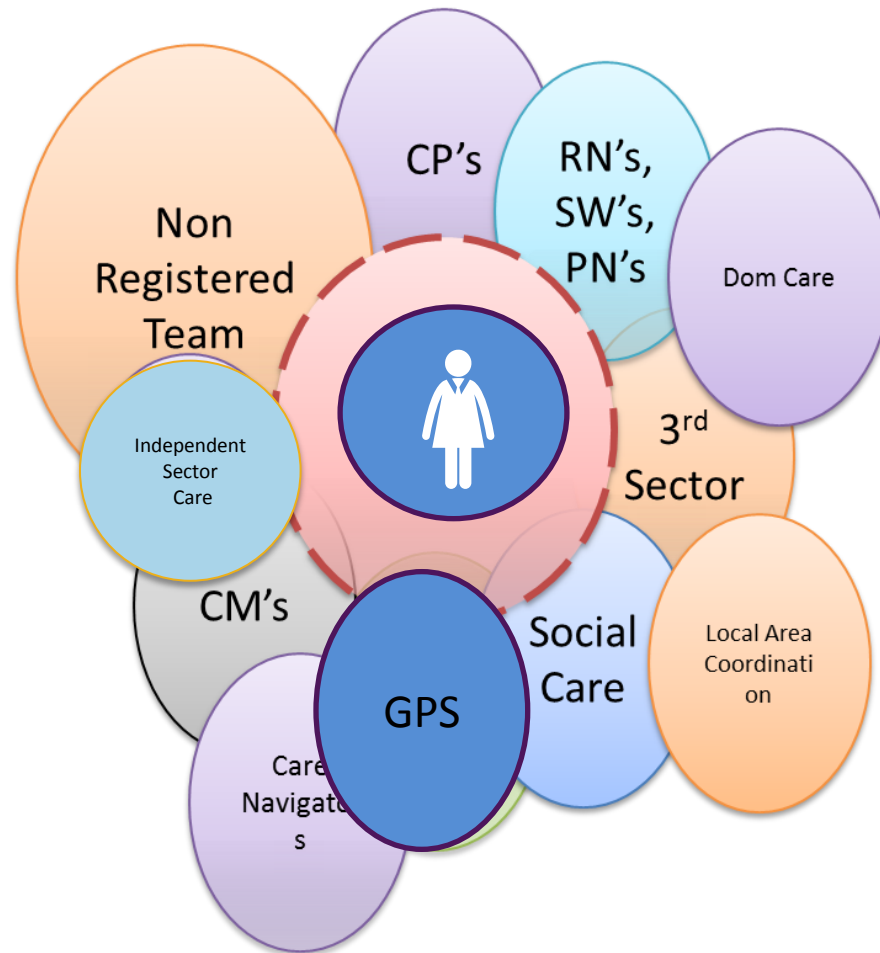
